

Evaluation and Update of the Sports Premium **2015-2016**

Another successful year culminating in achieving a Sainsbury Gold Kitemark. Throughout the year, we have increased the number of competition we have entered (18 → 28 with 612 places for children). Where we have progressed to Level 3 competitions in Football, finishing 3rd in the county, Rugby, finishing 4th in the county and cricket. We also finished district runners up in the girls and Year 4 cricket. Furthermore, we had more children than ever into the sprint finals of the Prince of Wales and finished second overall in the Field events.

Participation and engagement has increased within school. We have increased our inclusive house competitions to 9 events, where every child took part. In addition we have maintained a high percentage of children attending a range of extra-curricular clubs and 448 places were taken up.

A greater range of sporting opportunities within the curriculum. We have used the sports Premium money to buy in specialist coaches in a range of new and exciting activities such as Tri-Golf, handball and badminton. This built on the progress already made in volleyball, ultimate Frisbee and tennis. This also provided staff with valuable CPD as identified from the staff audit to ensure that they can continue next year and new areas can be explored.

Improved provision and delivery of curriculum content. Through the purchase of the Lancashire scheme of work, we improved the consistency of our progression and how the skills are taught. Through both internal (staff meetings) and external CPD (coaches and courses) we have improved the delivery of Scheme of work.

Improved leadership within the community. This year, the PE team has continue its role in leading sport within the cluster group. We have organised the Year 2 football tournament and the Year 4 orienteering competition. We also worked with another school to create a Year 3 and Year 4 football festival to increase participation and competition. We have also increased the number of links to clubs in the community (6-10) with Gloucester All Golds and Gloucester Rugby coming into school to coach our children.

A more healthy and aware school. A dedicated area leader, who achieved our Healthy Schools Status. Throughout the year, we had a walk to school week with a school walking bus, a specific healthy food unit within each class and the whole of Year 5 participated in the Cheltenham Junior Chef Competition. We also take our SMSC responsibilities seriously and every class had to evaluate and plan how they fit it into their curricula.
