### HISTORY and GEOGRAPHY

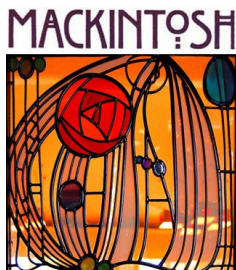
A study of Cheltenham including Cheltenham through the ages (whole school focus for Cheltenham week)

### MATHS

There will be a maths lesson each day, focusing on teaching both arithmetic and reasoning skills from the year 6 curriculum. This will be reflected in the set maths homework. If you are unsure about how to help, pop in and ask us. Maths homework will continue in the same way and should be completed each night ready to be marked the following day. Children are also encouraged to continue their progress toward Rock Hero status on Times Table Rockstars whenever they can.

### READING

Please continue to encourage your child to read for 20 minutes every school night. This should be recorded in their Reading Diary **4 times per week**. A written response is **still** required once a week to be ready for their Guided Reading session. Reading books and Reading Diaries **should** be in school each day.
