





# **Welcome from the Headteacher**


Dear Parents,

# **Spotlight on curriculum**

Our children have responded to their new learning units in History and Geography and as a staff we are delighted at the progress they are making. The new books have been a big hit with them! Our staff continue to develop the other areas of the curriculum so that it is carefully designed to ensure all our children achieve their full potential and are well prepared for the next stages of their education and beyond.

## **Attendance**

I would like to draw your attention to our Attendance Policy on the school website to remind you all of the procedures to follow in case of absence as well as the roles and responsibilities we all have to ensure good attendance for all our pupils. If a pupil misses 10% or more schooling across the school year, for whatever reason, they are defined as persistent absentees. Absence for whatever reason disadvantages a child by creating gaps in their learning. Research shows these gaps affect attainment when attendance falls below 95%. As such, we monitor all absence thoroughly. Where attendance or lateness is a cause for concern,

the following actions will be taken:

- The Headteacher and/or Assistant Head will arrange a meeting with parents/carers to discuss the reasons for the absences.
- The school will work closely with the parents/ carers to try and remove any barriers to regular attendance.
- Where appropriate, a formal Attendance Improvement Meeting will be held with the parents/carers, as well as the child, in order to draw up a plan, and set agreed targets. This plan will then be reviewed to ensure targets have been met. Should the parents/carers fail to attend, the meeting will continue and a plan drawn up in their absence.
- If attendance still does not improve, a referral
  will be made to the Education Entitlement and
  Inclusion Team. Parents/carers will be informed
  in writing of this referral and the possibility of
  prosecution.

We will be contact in January with parents whose children's attendance has dropped below this percentage and if necessary to arrange a meeting to devise supportive measures to improve it.
