


















Year 5 Artwork

The children were asked to create a piece of art with items that they found in the garden.
















Daisy worked really hard on this. She wrote a draft, edited it and spent time writing it in its best version independently.


Nabini, 5S, has done the most fantastic job of a history project she was given. I could see her working on it as she used Google Drive and she spent the majority of two whole days creating it.
