Dear Parents

I hope you are all well. Tomorrow we come out of the national lockdown and, as I'm sure you are all very aware, as a county, we enter Tier 2: <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/tier-2-high-alert>.

We have been really lucky up until now in terms of only having to send one class home, but more and more schools are seeing a rise in positive cases and therefore year group bubbles having to isolate.

In order to protect our school community as much as possible in the run up to Christmas, please from now on follow the bullet points below in line with our Risk Assessment and our additional protective measures. This is to ensure that we do everything possible as a school community to reduce the risk of a possible positive case(s) in school.

- All adults to wear a mask/visor on site
- The infant one way system **must** be adhered to at the beginning and at the end of the day. The children must stay with their adults at all times, children running around is understandably causing some angst with other parents and it is not helping our site protocols and is increasing the risk.
- Please as much as possible adhere to social distancing on site whilst waiting and keep any children who have been collected at 3pm with you whilst you wait for siblings at 3:15pm.
- If you have received a negative test result please let the office know on either admin@wardenhill.gloucs.sch.uk or 01242 523827 before or on the morning that the children come back into school.
- We will continue to ensure that there is ventilation at all times during the school day in the classrooms and that there is a full 'air' change during break and lunchtimes – as per our Risk Assessment.
- We will not be launching our clubs until after Christmas and will send out an updated club list towards the end of term with more information as to how the booking of these clubs will run from now on. Thank you for your understanding with this.

I really hope that we make it to the 18th December without any positive cases – but if it does happen at least we will know that we have all played our part in reducing the risk as much as possible.
