SCHOOL STREETS

The School Streets Scheme is still in place to encourage walking, cycling and scooting for the school run.

You must not drive along Durham Close at the times when the road is closed to moving traffic (8.15-9.15am and 2.30-3.30pm) unless you have a blue School Streets permit for your vehicle or a Blue Badge.

If you have a permit and you need to drive along Durham Close at a time when it is closed, please drive at 5mph with your hazard lights on and take extra care.

If you have to bring your children to school by car, please try to park a few minutes walk away from the school to avoid congestion, particularly on Lincoln Avenue and Lichfield Drive.

Wherever you park, this must not be on yellow zig-zags or any single or double yellow lines (many of these are now enforceable by the parking enforcement officers) or on/across private driveways or private parking spaces.

Where possible, please try to walk, cycle or scoot to school with your child - it's healthier and safer for your family and the school community.

RAPID LATERAL FLOW TESTING FOR HOUSEHOLDS

From 1 March 2021, if you're a member of a household, childcare bubble or support bubble of staff or a pupil you can get a twice-weekly test through your employer if they offer testing to employees, at a local test site, by collecting a home test kit from a test site, by ordering a home test kit online

Get a test through your employer

Your workplace may offer rapid lateral flow testing to you. Contact your employer to find out more.

Take a test at a rapid lateral flow test site

You can take a rapid lateral flow test at a local site. Testing at these sites is assisted, which means you will swab yourself under the supervision of a trained operator. You may need to book an appointment.

Collect test kits

You can collect 2 packs of home test kits at a local collection point. Each pack contains 7 tests. Anyone 18 or over can collect. Most collection points are open from 1.30pm to 7pm. You can check online if the location is open or busy before you go. You do not need to make an appointment. Do not visit a collection point outside opening hours, as it may be used to test people with coronavirus symptoms outside these times.

Order home test kits online

If you cannot get tested at your workplace, or are unable to go to a test site or collect test kits, you can order a home test kit online. Do not order online if you can get a test through other methods. This frees up home delivery for those who need it most.
