
#### YEAR 6 CURRY COOKING

Year 3 experienced life as Stone age people as part of their history unit











# Year 2: Badge Design

Year 2 Designed their own Super Hero badge as part of their Design and Technology unit















#### YEAR 1: ANTARCTICA

## Science day

On the 2nd December our children joined over 9000 other children across the country to take part in a Science day hosted by Integra Science. Each year group were given a Christmas related enquiry question to answer:

Year 1 and 2 - The reindeer's noses get too cold when they're pulling Santa's sleigh. We need to make them nose warmers. Which material should we use? Year 3 and 4 - Santa mustn't wake up sleeping children, but his shoes keep making noisy footsteps. How can you help him by muffling the sound? Year 5 and 6 -Santa's getting old and he's finding it hard to carry presents down chimneys. Would a pulley help him?

First, our children had to think about which type of enquiry they needed to do. Then, they had to work together to plan and carry out their investigations. We were so impressed by our children's ability to apply their knowledge and to work as a team to find the answer to their question to help Santa and his reindeer. At the end of the day we had the opportunity to share our ideas online.
