

Curriculum Progression Map 2023-2024

Warden Hill Primary School intends to instil a love of languages within its pupils. We will ensure we offer a relevant, broad and ambitious curriculum that will inspire and excite our Key Stage Two pupils using a wide range of topics and themes. All pupils will be given the opportunity to explore a new language through its vocabulary, grammar and phonetics. They will understand where they belong in the world through the study on another culture and how it links to our own, developing a better understanding of self. Pupils will succeed and achieve their full potential through the encouragement of high expectations and excellent standards. The ultimate aim being that pupils will feel positive and confident about learning languages and be able to continue studying languages beyond key stage 2.

We intend to adopt a whole class approach and teach French to all children within key stage 2. The four language learning skills; listening, speaking, reading and writing will be taught and all necessary grammar will be covered in an age-appropriate way. As a result, pupils will be able to use and apply what they have learnt in multiple contexts and will have made solid foundations for future language learning. The intent is that the class teacher will use the Languages Angels scheme of work as well as other resources to deliver these lessons, creating a dynamic programme of study that will be clearly outlined in both long-term and short-term planning. Planning will ensure that the foreign language knowledge of our pupils progresses within each academic year and is extended throughout the primary phase.

- write phrases from memory, and adapt these to create new sentences, to express ideas clearly.
- describe people, places, things and actions orally and in writing.
- understand basic French grammar such as: gender, articles, pronouns, adjectival agreement and verb conjugation
