The Multiplication Tables Check MTC

The Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) is a statutory online assessment in England for Year 4 pupils to test their fluency in recalling times tables up to 12×12 , with 25 questions answered in 6 seconds each.

Purpose: To assess whether pupils can fluently recall their times tables up to 12×12 .

How it works

Format: An online, on-screen test.

Questions: 25 questions on multiplication facts.

Timing: Pupils have 6 seconds to answer each question.

Content: Questions cover a range of multiplication tables, focusing on facts taught in Key Stage 2.

Why it's done:

- To help schools identify pupils who need additional help to master their times tables.
- Fluent recall of multiplication facts is essential for future mathematical understanding and success.



Supporting Time Tables at Home

Small short bursts (10-15minutes)

Counting up in the steps as you walk to school, go up the stairs, playing catch.

Listening to multiplication songs

E.g. Laugh Along and Learn

Use online resources as they are fantastic!

- Hit the Button
- TT Rockstars
 - All children have their log in stuck in at the back of their reading journal.
 - It is adapted to suit your child's needs and will change as they improve.
 - It also has a section called Soundcheck which is set up exactly like the MTC. We would recommend waiting to use this part until they are confident with all their times tables.



Reading at home

Year 4

Your child should be reading every night, but as a minimum recording that they have read at least 4 times a week for 15 minutes.

Book Talk Task

Each week, every year group sets aside a time in class to talk all things books. Your child should make some notes on the task. These notes should act as prompt to remind them about what they would like to share. They may use bullet points, a mind map, a list or something else that works for them. It is such a privilege to dive into book talk and all children are to participate in this discussion.

At home, it would also be beneficial to the progression of reading, if your child was read to. Please do spend time listening and reading to your child. We all know the power of language development and the part reading has to play in boosting your child's vocabulary. Please do continue to be an influence in your child's reading journey.
