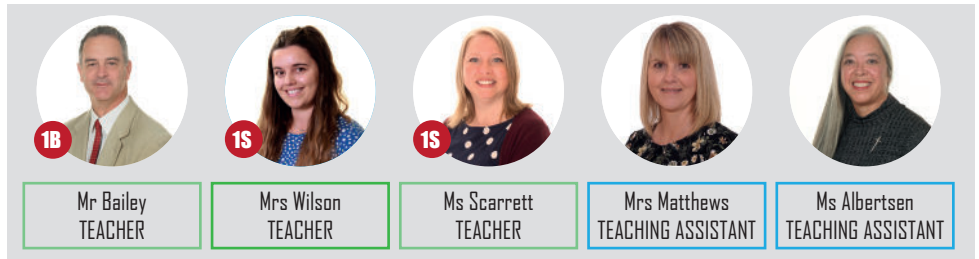


# YEAR ONE

 CURRICULUM NEWSLETTER

AUTUMN 2025



Dear Parents,

We would like to welcome you back to school and the start of Year 1. We are very excited about the start of the new term! We have lots of fun activities planned that will help the children settle back into school allowing them to adapt to new routines and build on existing friendships and make new ones.

## EVERYDAY NECESSITIES

Please ensure your child brings their jumper, coat, water bottle and book bag (containing their reading book and reading journal) to school each day.

PE kits should be kept in a named draw-string bag and taken home each half term to wash.

- School T-Shirt in house colour with school logo
- Plain navy blue or plain black PE shorts
- Trainers
- PE socks for girls who wear tights to school

## READING AT HOME

We will not be giving out reading books until Tuesday 9th September so that we have had time to read with each child and assess where they are to ensure we start them on the right book. In the meantime,

please continue to use the fabulous local libraries / Red Cross bookshop etc. to enjoy stories with your child and share as many books as you can.

Children will continue to have their books changed once a week (every Monday). This is because we want children to read their books three times to help them develop all of their reading skills.

- The first read will focus on their decoding skills - to read phonically regular words and recognise common exception words.
- The second read should focus on their understanding of what the text is about.
- By the third read we want your child to feel like an expert and enjoy sharing the story with fluency and explore using expression. Expression can be usefully modelled by you reading a sentence using the correct expression and your child copying it.

## **SPELLING**

Spelling is taught explicitly. In each year group, there are a number of Common Exception Words (CEWs) which do not always follow phonological/spelling rules. Children will regularly practise these words within class. The words that the children are learning are words that they will be expected to apply in their own writing across the curriculum. We may send some of these CEWs home for your child to practice later in the year.

## **PE**

PE sessions will take place on a Thursday and Friday. PE kits will need to be brought to school in a named PE bag and can be left in our PE chests until the end of each half term. Your child will be changing for PE in the classroom each session. Any practice they can have of taking off their uniform, making sure the clothes are not inside out and folding them neatly ready to put on again would be appreciated!

Active lunch sessions will take place on Thursday for 1S and Friday for 1B. On these days your child will need to bring trainers as they will be on the field over lunchtime and it may well be muddy. They will wear the rest of their normal school uniform.

## CURRICULUM

### Autumn 1:

- ART: Exploring different types of lines. Self portraits in a variety of different ways: charcoal, digital, painting, pop-art.
- SCIENCE: Learning about parts of our bodies and grouping animals.
- PE: Gymnastics
- RE: Creation Story – Key Question: Does God want Christians to look after the world?
- MUSIC: Keeping a steady pulse using a variety of instruments. Learning about low, medium and high pitch.
- ENGLISH: Letter formation and handwriting, ensuring the children have the correct pencil grip and form letters correctly. This is me: writing informative sentences about themselves. Writing a list: The Gingerbread Man
- PHONICS: Recap of Phase 4 blending sounds to read and write words
- MATHS: Place value and addition and subtraction within 10, Counting 1 to 20, number lines and numerals, number bonds to 10
- PHSE: Beginning and Belonging – how to manage new situations, who can help me at home and school
- COMPUTING: Exploring different painting programmes (We Are Painters – digital portraits).

### Autumn 2:

- GEOGRAPHY: Where is my school and local area? Looking at aerial views and maps.
- MATHS: Addition and Subtraction – Place value (within 20), 2D and 3D shapes
- PE: Dance / Ball Skills
- RE: The Christmas Story
- MUSIC: Sounds interesting – exploring sounds
- PSHE: My Emotions – understanding and managing feelings
- ENGLISH: The Owl Who Was Affraid Of The Dark, Tiddler, Stickman, Christmas Present
- SCIENCE: Seasonal changes: Autumn and Winter
- DT: Christmas moving pictures
- COMPUTING: Exploring different painting programmes (We Are Painters – digital portraits).

## READING CHALLENGE

As in Reception, a key area of the curriculum continues to be reading. As an incentive to promote reading we would like to introduce our special Year One Reading Challenge:

For an extra bit of fun, we have created a challenge grid with lots of exciting and interesting tasks. If your child completes 20 of the tasks by Christmas and has each task signed by a parent, they will receive a special reading certificate. We will stick a copy of the challenge in the back of the reading journals and talk to the children each week about which challenges they have enjoyed. We hope you have fun completing the tasks and look forward to hearing about them.
