

## Roles and responsibilities of a Reading Ambassador

The role of a Reading Ambassador:

- You will attend weekly meetings with Mrs Jones, Mrs Sperduti and the other Reading Ambassadors.
- You will gather ideas and suggestions from your class to promote a love of reading at Warden Hill and share these at Reading Ambassador meetings.
- You will deliver book reviews, recommend reading and share the latest 'book drop' with your class to help develop a love of reading.
- You will help to organise and run the class libraries, book nooks and the lunchtime reading shed.
- You will encourage pupils in your class to be aware of their school environment and to respect and care for it.
- You will help with whole-school reading events, such as author visits, World Book Day and book fairs.

To be a successful Reading Ambassador you need to:

- Take pride in helping to look after books and reading spaces.
- Have a passion for reading and want to promote a love of reading at Warden Hill.
- Be a good role model for reading in your class and around the school.
- Commit time to this role and accept that you may need to do things during break times and lunchtimes.
- Be enthusiastic.

You will need to write a short letter or create a poster for your class teacher explaining why you would be an excellent Reading Ambassador. Your class teacher will then choose a Reading Ambassador for that term.
